Head Start Education

South Shore Head Start & Child Care seeks to create an environment that promotes a sense of self-worth, support and achievement, as well as, encouraging positive social interaction for children and families through the components of the South Shore Head Start & Child Care Programs.

Head Start Is...

Head Start is a federally funded program for families of children ages 3-5. Children must be 3 by August 31st.

How We Can Help

The Head Start program offers education, nutritional, health and social services to preschool children, including special needs children from limited income families.

Classes are held five (5) days a week, September through May with regular school vacations, from 8:30 am - 12:30 p.m. Some all day/all year classrooms are available. Transportation and meals are provided.

Eligibility Guidelines

You Are Eligible If:

- You live in one of the following towns: Plymouth,
 Marshfield, Kingston, Carver, Duxbury, Pembroke, Halifax,
 Hanover, Plympton, Scituate, Cohasset, Hingham & Norwell.
- Your family meets the income guidelines below.
- Your family exceeds the guidelines below, but your child has special needs.
- You have a foster child.
- Those receiving TAFDC or Social Security benefits.

How Can We Help?

The Head Start program is based at our child care sites in Plymouth and Marshfield serving children from 2.9 years up until the child is eligible for Kindergarten. The child care program is designed to create an atmosphere that encourages self-confidence, school readiness, independence and intellectual curiosity. Classroom materials for each child promote their individual development while field trips and special activities provide new experiences. Center-based programs provide breakfast, lunch and afternoon snack for all children and transportation is available if needed, at designated bus stops. Center-based child care programs are open 12 months a year. Hours of operation are from 7:30 am to 5:30 p.m.

Who Can We Help?

Child Care payment for SSCAC are based on a sliding scale fee for families meeting the Early Education and Care eligibility guidelines. The Childcare program accepts Early Education and Care Vouchers.

How Can We Help?

To be eligible both parents must be working at least 30 hours, seeking employment, enrolled in college or vocational school, participating in training program or have a disability or a child with a disability.
